Throughout the policy there is reference to making records. The policy includes details of what should be included in many of these records, where this can be defined.

Sample policy and procedure

This guidance sets out good practice measures for the safe management and handling of medicines in care homes (with nursing) for older people by care assistants.

1.1.2 Care home providers should have a care home medicines policy, which they review to make sure it is up to date, and is based on current legislation and the best available evidence. The policy should include written processes for: sharing information about a resident's medicines, including when they transfer between care settings

Nursing home administrators may work in nursing homes, assisted living facilities, or retirement communities. No matter the setting, they must provide the necessary leadership that ensures a safe and efficient environment for staff and patients. ... How to Become a Licensed Nursing Home Administrator

Administration Care workers should only administer medicines when this is clearly documented in the care plan. The care workers must be trained and competent to do so. The prescriber's directions must be clear, specific and unambiguous.

Administering medicines in home care agencies | Care ...

Care homes must have a written policy and procedure on the administration of medicines. Staff working in the home should be aware of the policy and should be working to it at all times. Registered nurses must also work to The Code - Professional standards of practice and behaviour for nurses, midwives and nursing associates (NMC 2018).

Medicines management in care homes | Medicines management ...

A nursing home administrator, a licensed health care professional, is the chief executive officer for the skilled nursing facility. They manage a facility that operates 24/7/365 that gives continuous care for residents who are critically ill.

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Complete a risk assessment as part of a standard operating procedure or policy. Care plans should highlight who can use the oxygen. There must not be a blanket policy for use.

To reduce the risk of harm associated with medicine administration, it is recommended that care home staff undertake appropriate training and development, and care home providers are clear on staff's roles and responsibilities (National Care Forum, 2013; 2011).
